... **Did you know?**



- All high school students should be in their first scheduled class/homeroom at 8:00 a.m. FREE breakfast will be served to students at 7:30 a.m.
- Attendance is very important and students should miss no more than 11 days per year. Being late will have a negative impact on your child's attendance and grades.
- All CMSD schools have a dress code.
- Students must pass all 5 parts of the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT), which includes Reading, Writing, Math, Science, and Social Studies.
- High School students first take the OGT in March of their 10th grade year. They will continue to take it in the months of June, October, and March until they pass all 5 parts.
- Your child must be able to read and write English in order to pass the OGT.
- Your child needs 22 credits to graduate from high school, which includes:

English: 4 Credits

Math: 3 Credits

Science: 3 Credits

Social Studies: 3 Credits

Physical Education: ½ Credit

Health: ½ Credit

Fine Arts: 1 Credit

Foreign Language: 1 Credit

Senior Seminar: ½ Credit

Electives: 5½ Credits

22 Credits to graduate from high school

- Progress reports are received 4 times per year. September 24, December 2, February 19, May 6
- Parent-Teacher conferences are held 3 times per year; November 22, January 22, March 22
